





Landscape



Located immediately west of the village of Marsannay-la-Côte, Les Grandes Vignes extends from 941 to 974 feet (287 to 297 meters), in altitude of average 958 feet (292 meters). The slope is gentle, from 2 to 3.5%, with an average value of 3% for the area. The "climate" is due east.

Soil and subsoil



The subsoil of Grandes Vignes is largely faulted and consists of *Ostrea acuminata* marl in its central part. On either side, the Comblanchien Limestone is present to the west and to the east. The Crinoidal Limestone outcrops at the western end. Red clays mask the Jurassic substratum in the southeast.

Background

The name of the place refers to the culture of the vine. The use of the article "les" in the name of the place translates means the establishment of the current name after the year 1000. The qualifying adjective "grandes" can refer either to the surface of the vineyard or to its height.

Wines

Red Wine



The color is ruby, with purple reflections when young. The coloring intensity is always strong. The nose is made up of notes of very ripe fruits (blackcurrant, blackberry), combined with notes of humus and spices.

The palate is always well concentrated, ripe and fleshy, supported by an acidic freshness typical of the marl terroir. The tannins are often powerful and racy, with a sweet texture on the finish.

This wine is to be associated with typical dishes of the region, beef bourguignon, roasts and beautiful white meats.

Serving temperature : 15 à 17 °C
